Ashbourne Campus

Ashbourne Campus has had a very positive start to the 2020 school year with 30 students in 2 classes Highlights have included

- Quality start program with a special focus on awareness, belonging and connection
- School values, rights and responsibilities
- Developing ready to learn plans, understanding our bodies and using self-regulation strategies
- Kind = Happy

Last Friday we had a brilliant day of learning and fun at Horseshoe Bay as we participated in the Surf Safety program. This day was funded through the Sporting Schools program and will complement the school swimming lessons to be held in week 4.

Milang Campus

- 2020 has started well with our 7 new students settling in well to the Junior Primary class. We have welcomed back Christine Rollins as their teacher and she has provided an excellent start for them. Our other class, year 4-6 is being taught by Merran Jolley who has returned for another year.
- Both classes have embraced our EFS whole school Berry Street training and deep learning focus setting up classroom expectations with 'Ready to Learn' plans and revisiting the 21st learning skills (communication, creativity, collaboration, character, citizenship and critical thinking).
 To complement this we have had a visit from SAPOL to talk with the Upper students about cyber safety and the Junior class about community policing.
- Looking back at 2019 we celebrated our successful Milk Bottle Regatta which saw teams of students from all Primary campuses and local schools, building boats from milk bottles and racing on Lake Alexandrina. It was a great showcase of STEM design thinking being put into a real life situation with great results (only 1 boat collapsed!). We have already starting planning for our 2020 event!
- For 2020 our focus' will be Reading; developing critical literacy skills and providing sustainable targeted intervention strategies Maths; embedding core concepts and stretching higher bands students Wellbeing; Raising self esteem to improve motivation for learning through targeted programs. Looking forward to reporting back to you throughout the year.

Langhorne Creek Campus

- The Langhorne Creek campus continues to go from strength to strength over the last 12 months, consolidating our approaches across campus as well as working to ensure consistency across EFS R-6 sites. Enrolments remained in the low 70s for 2019 which through additional funding from the wider EFS budget allowed us to remain at 4 classes. Our staffing remained the same for the year with the only change being Bree Leibhardt who came in to provide some extra SSO support for the year.
- In looking ahead to 2020 it was clearly apparent that maintaining 4 classes wasn't financially viable and at the end of the year Hannah Tilley was farewelled. Hannah had held several contract

- Jacqui Maynard, our Pastoral Care Worker, decided to resign from her position to take up several opportunities to further her career. Jacqui had worked at the campus for 5 years and had a positive impact with a number of staff and families.
- Playcentre continues to go from strength to strength, helping to consolidate the early years program at the campus. Having the Playcentre on site provides many benefits to not only the young children and their parents but also school students who enjoy the opportunity to interact with family and friends at the break time. In looking to 2020 we will be adjusting the campus timetable to provide greater opportunities for early years staff and the head of campus to mix and support the Playcentre program.
- Resourcing of campus facilities has been an ongoing issue and it was pleasing to see progress in this area during 2019. New laptops were provided to the campus which has seen a large improvement in student skills as they are more reliable than the previous devices.
- The state of facilities continues to be front and centre. The new toilet block, which was commissioned at the end of term 1 was warmly received by everyone. This had been an ongoing project for many years and everyone involved should be congratulated for their continued support of the project.
- The rest of the facilities are in need of major repairs and we will continue to work with departmental officers towards the development of a plan to address issues.
- Camps were warmly received by many students and their families. The 2/3 and 3/4 classes participated in a ZooSnooze whilst the 5/6 class participated in a 3 day camp to Adelaide. Our aim is to work towards the development of a cyclic program which gradually builds up over a student's time here at Langhorne Creek Campus.
- Sporting Schools program was a welcome addition to the Health and PE program at the campus. During the year we were able to obtain specialised coaching in touch rugby, tennis and water safety, along with funding to support the purchase of equipment. We hope to be able to continue this program in 2020, subject to successful grant funding.
- 2020 will provide us with a number of opportunities to strengthen our environmental ed, gardening, and sustainability programs through a range of partnerships with local community members, NRM Education officers and a Landcare grant. Key to this will be the development of an ongoing plan, adequate resourcing and clear links to the curriculum to ensure that key outcomes are being met.
- The support provide to the campus by parents and members of CAC is warmly received and we look forward to a continued partnership in the future.
