OPEN ACCESS & SCHOOL OF LANGUAGES

- If EFS does not offer a subject that you are very interested in undertaking, it may be possible to seek an enrolment at Open Access, if they offer the subject
- If there is a language you are very interested in undertaking, it may be possible to seek an enrolment at the School of Languages
- Both of these options can be chosen as a preference and meetings will occur with a leader early in 2026 to discuss any possible enrolment

IMPORTANT INFORMATION

Year 12 signals the end of the SACE journey for most students. Therefore, students in Year 12 are expected to approach their education with maximum personal responsibility and commitment in order to achieve their goals.

By now students will generally have made important decisions about their pathways out of school and beyond and will now need to consider their individual subject pathway. The school offers extensive individualised support to each and every student in order to reach their future goals.

SUBJECT RECOMMENDATIONS AT EASTERN FLEURIEU SCHOOL

We strive for personal and academic success for all students, and appropriate subjects is key.

The following subject recommendations are based on a 10-year analysis of grade, wellbeing and pathway completion data. Families are encouraged to explore subject selection choices in line with the recommendations below:

- A-B grades (full choice of subjects)
- C grade (a concern raised about passing)
- D-E grades (Application against recommendation)

If you wish to choose a course where you have not met the expected level in the previous year, or where a teacher has not recommended you for a particular subject, you will need to fill in an "Against Recommendations" form. This will need to be signed by parent/carers.

If you have excelled in a certain subject and are looking to extend and challenge yourself, you may wish to apply for a course at a higher year level. You will need to fill in an "Application for Advancement" form. This will need to be signed by a parent/carer.

- A parent/carer is encouraged to attend with students
- Students must bring this booklet with their preferences filled in
- A leader will discuss your choices and fill in the Web Preferences with you
