THE SERIOUS PART... IMPORTANT INFORMATION

Year 11 brings with it the full experience of SACE, and the first taste of a Stage 2 subject. Therefore, students in Year 11 are expected to approach their education with an increased level of personal responsibility and commitment to establish the study habits required for a successful completion of the senior years.

SUBJECT RECOMMENDATIONS AT EASTERN FLEURIEU SCHOOL

We strive for personal and academic success for all students. Choosing appropriate subjects is key.

The following subject recommendations are based on a 10-year analysis of grade, wellbeing and pathway completion data. Families are encouraged to explore subject selection choices in line with the recommendations below:

- A-B grades (full choice of subjects)
- C grade (a concern raised about passing)
- D-E grades (Application against recommendation)

If you wish to choose a course where you have not met the expected level in the previous year, or where a teacher has not recommended you for a particular subject, you will need to fill in an "Against Recommendations" form. This will need to be signed by parent/carers.

If you have excelled in a certain subject and are looking to extend and challenge yourself, you may wish to apply for a course at a higher year level. You will need to fill in an "Application for Advancement" form. This will need to be signed by a parent/carer.

SUBJECT SELECTION CONFERENCE

- Sessions will run for 10 minutes
- Bookings will be made via Schoolzine
- A parent/carer is encouraged to attend with students
- Students must bring this booklet with their preferences filled in
- A leader will discuss your choices and fill in the Web Preferences with you
- Students will not have access to Web Preferences for themselves
- Against Recommendation and Application for Advancement forms will be available
