Primary Campus Visits



Early in Term 3, Ambassadors kicked off the program with Q&A visits to each of the EFS R-6 campuses and Meadows Primary School. These sessions gave Year 6 students the chance to ask real questions about what to expect in high school — everything from lockers and lunchtimes to homework, teachers, and friendships. There were plenty of laughs, thoughtful questions, and reassuring answers — all delivered with kindness, honesty, and good humour.

7 - 12 Campus Tours



Across Weeks 7 - 9, Ambassadors led small-group tours of the 7–12 Campus, guiding students through classrooms and shared spaces like the canteen and yard areas. These familiarisation tours were designed to help students start picturing themselves at high school — and to ease some of the natural nerves that come with big transitions.

"After a few weeks of hard work, our tours kicked off in Week 7. Students started to understand so much about high school, they could have led the tours themselves! With all seriousness, the tours were great — fresh faces and a few 'I remember you!' moments helped students quickly learn the school like the back of their hand."
